



Your insurance plan will pay the cost of certain medications or make it less expensive for others. Visit your plans website or call your insurer directly to determine if your medication is covered.

Your insurance can be used to visit a doctor or health care provider. Visiting a doctor in your plan's network will give you the best deal.





In case of emergency, you should go to the closest hospital despite your insurance's approval. Your plan cannot charge you more for an out-of-network hospital in emergency cases.

Insurance may cover a variety of other healthcare related items such as laboratory tests, vaccines, and education.





Certain plans are mandated to provide mental health care under the Affordable Care Act.

Health Insurance And Your Liver

All Health Insurance Marketplace plans and the majority of private insurance plans cover hepatitis A and B vaccines.
