ADVOCACY WEEK

Well over 100 advocates met virtually with elected officials and staff during the pandemic to share their stories and discuss ALF's advocacy agenda.



10,000 individuals participated in our annual email-based advocacy campaign.



Patient advocates joined listening sessions with FDA employees and spoke on FDA panels and at hearings.

PROVIDER EDUCATION

In addition to traditional education opportunities through webinars and Continuing Medical Education classes, ALF engaged providers through innovative programs like the Academic Debates, Mock Liver Tumor Boards, and regional Medical Advisory Board meetings.

COVID-19 RESPONSE

People with liver disease have an elevated risk for COVID-19 infection and more severe complications. Since the start of the pandemic, over two million patients and health care professionals accessed our virtual education, information, and support services. COVID-19 specific content covered topics like transplantation, caregiving, healthy eating at home, and disease specific information.




